Sue Daniels Gives One-Room Schoolhouse Talk

Sue Daniels of the Michigan One-Room School-house Association (MORSA) spoke to the members of the Chester-field Historical Society at their December 7, 2004 meeting. A teacher for over

40 years, Sue Daniels, also a librarian, has been head of the Greenmead Association for the last 25 years and is on the board of MORSA. The Greenmead Association and MORSA are both involved in the preservation and restora-

tion of Michigan's historic buildings. Sue talked and gave a slide show demonstration for over an hour, illustrating and lecturing about little-known facets of the history of the one-room schoolhouse in Michigan.
